St Ives is 6th out of 16,783 primary schools in England and tops the rankings across the whole of the South West of England! The school even got a write up...

St Ives Primary and Nursery School in Ringwood, Dorset, which tops the rankings in the southwest of England and comes sixth in the national table, up from 435 in 2019, is also prioritising mental health. It has signed up to a programme run by myHappymind, which helps schools to teach emotional self-regulation and tools to build confidence.
